**A world of love for Lee, our hero**



**SADLY**, friends and colleagues gathered last night for an emotional vigil to honour murdered soldier Lee Rigby.

The 25-year-old's son Jack, five, wore a Manchester United shirt with the name 'Rigby' on the back as his father's coffin was carried to his parish church.

The drummer in the 2nd Battalion Royal Regiment of Fusiliers

was killed as he returned to Wombwell barracks on May 21.

A private military funeral service will take place today.

Drummer Rigby's wife Rebecca (pictured), 30, said: "We have had an awful lot of support from across the world. It's unbelievable really, the things that have been coming in. We have had letters from the Prime Minister, from senior politi-

cians from all parties, the Duke of Kent, from the Sikh community. Various large mosques and interfaith groups have been in touch with letters of condolence."

She also recalled how two small gestures had meant so much to her. "I was handed £100, two 50p coins and a flip phone, that had

## FESTIVAL WIRELESS

The Wireless Festival has gone through various rock/dance musical phases but 2013 feels like a pronounced shift. There's a new home (the former Olympic site, after eight years in Hyde Park), a new sponsor and a bill that represents a massive, glossy convergence of transatlantic pop and hip hop, with a side order of electronica.

The festival's multi-arena format now packs in more acts than ever (including a stage of rising talent presented by youth broadcaster SB.TV) but it's really characterised by its headline stars. Tonight, Justin Timberlake seizes the spotlight in a swirl of sharp-suited, slickly choreographed r'n'b from The 20/20 Experience; he's also given to the odd acoustic guitar serenade too. He's ably backed by rap and soul hit-makers including Snoop Dogg, Trey Songz and Frank Ocean, while a clubby energy rush comes from the likes of dubstep producer Sub Focus.

Tomorrow, Jay Z heads the bill with what should be a stadium-sized performance; Hova comes hyped from the release of his Magna Carta... Holy Grail album, and he's become increasingly at home on major festival stages.

Further big voices on the bill include Emeli Sandé, Rita Ora

and Kendrick Lamar, while Calvin Harris brings the epic dance stormers.

Sunday night is the Timberlake and Jay Z show, as both take centre stage together from 7.45pm. They're not giving masses away about their live hook-up but Timberlake is a featured singer on Magna Carta, so there's the promise of collaborative material and mash-ups. Elsewhere, there's

a solid range of hip hop including former rival king of New York Nas and the reformed A Tribe Called Quest, plus irrepressible showman Will.i.am (hopefully accompanied by his robot dancers) and the exhilarating tunes of Katy B and Magnetic Man. **Arwa Haider**

## CLASSICAL THE PROMS

If you like classical music, or you're classical-curious, then hit the high C for joy as the greatest show on Earth rolls into town for its 118th year, with familiar and fresh musical delights.

The Proms' opening weekend mixes TV scores and new commissions with much-loved warhorses, as a taster of the eclecticism of this year's season.

Tonight's concert kicks off with the world premiere of Julian Anderson's four-minute piece Harmony, followed by Benjamin Britten's magical Sea Interludes from Peter Grimes. In a fascinating pairing, Rachmaninov's Rhapsody on a Theme of Paganini (famously used in Brief Encounter) is coupled with Lutostawski's rarely-heard Variations on the same theme. The concert ends with Vaughan Williams's stirring A Sea Symphony.

The hugely popular Doctor Who Prom (tomorrow, repeated Sun)

returns to the festival for the third time. There'll be music – past and present – from the series, plus family-friendly classical blockbusters and some special guests from the show making a surprise appearance.

The fantastic period-instrument ensemble Les Siècles, famous for blowing the cobwebs off familiar works, brings a programme of French ballet music spanning two centuries on Sunday. Works by Lully, Rameau, Delibes and Massenet build up to a must-hear authentic-instrument performance of Stravinsky's Rite of Spring, conducted by François-Xavier Roth. And there are plenty of Proms Plus events – talks, discussions and lectures – every day too.
