Power profits rise 74% in 48 months

PROFITS at the big six energy companies have shot up 74 per cent since 2009 – dwarfing inflation's rise of 13 per cent.

British Gas, E.On, EDF, npower, ScottishPower and SSE have enjoyed a £3.3billion surge in profits as households have been hit by a 29 per cent rise in bills.

Profits from the groups – which provide energy to 98 per cent of homes – rose from £2.15billion in 2009 to £2.22billion in 2010, £3.87billion in 2011 and £3.74billion in 2012.

The typical domestic dual fuel bill now stands at £1,420 a year, compared with £1,100 in May 2010, according to regulator Ofgem.

'With news of multi-million-pound profits, and spiralling energy prices consistently one of people's top concerns, it's no surprise that just a quarter of us trust energy companies,' said Which? executive director Richard

Lloyd. 'People will not feel confident that they are getting a fair deal unless energy prices are simplified and the costs that make up our bills are open, transparent and subject to robust scrutiny.'

Shadow energy secretary Caroline Flint added: 'The public have been left with a £3.3billion price tag for David Cameron's failure to act on ripoff energy bills.

'He's totally out of touch with millions of people and small businesses who are struggling with soaring energy bills.'

But Energy UK, which represents the industry, said the companies needed to make profits in order to invest for the future.

Skating hotspot is back on a roll



OR many Londoners of a certain age, Thursday nights, roller discos and King's Cross are forever linked, and we wept actual tears when Canvas - the site of many a tipsy trundle closed five years ago. So the news that a pop-up roller disco has arrived this summer in the rapidly redeveloping area will have many former skate fans pulling on the legwarmers.

Skate King's Cross, open until September 6, is in a covered space next to the Granary Building, the new home of Central Saint Martins. The roller rink holds up to 100 skaters per session, while another 200 can pack into the adjacent bar and viewing area.

The temporary rink is designed

by boutique London architects Feix&Merlin, whose assignments include beach huts, theatre sets and warehouse renovations.

'We've really been able to have fun with this project and I think this comes through in the final design,' says Tarek Merlin. 'We've used raw, heavy materials, in keeping with the industrial heritage of the area, but we've also used gold chainmail and custom light installations to reference the recent past, when King's Cross was a mecca for clubbers, ravers and skaters.'

During the day, the rink welcomes families and children, while at night, DJs including Hannah Holland and Damon Martin of Disco Bloodbath will provide the soundtrack.

And since this is a roller disco 2.0, greasy chips will not do; the food is provided by pop-up masters Disco Bistro, along with guest chefs including Gizzi Erskine, Yum Bun, Chef Jocky, Street Kitchen and Lucky Chip.


